- Developed and prototyped an income generation programme within their organisation using tried and tested models, frameworks and templates
- Honed their ability to lead their stakeholders through the changes their new model requires
- Built a network of NPC leaders who can support them as they continue to lead sustainability in their organisations

Total cost per participant	R29 000

The programme entails highly interactive modules that include a combination of workshops, lectures, facilitated discussions, syndicate group interaction, engagement with business leaders and case-study clinics. Half-day think tanks held between each module are designed to stimulate thinking and to generate and test new ideas in a supportive environment of co-thinking with peers.
